### Comment text:

I am writing to you on behalf of Bishop's Stortford Conservatives, of which I am the Chair. My party is in full support of the East Herts Council Conservative Group's submission. My members are particularly in support of the idea of the River Stort forming a strong ward boundary within Bishop's Stortford. Having two wards represented by four councillors exclusively on the eastern side of Stortford will significantly improve the effectiveness of local representation and governance. As a resident of the current Bishop's Stortford All Saints Ward, I fully support the approach taken by the East Herts Council Conservative Group in proposing boundaries in my area. Using Dunmow Road (and the streets accessed exclusively off it) as the northern boundary for the new proposed All Saints ward makes a lot of sense. Dunmow Road, along with Hockerill Street which it runs into at its western end, provides the main east-west artery through the proposed All Saints Ward. There are two main north-south routes through the ward. The first is London Road which branches off into Hallingbury Road. The second is Dane Street which then merges into the new Link Road through the Goods Yard site. This Dane Street-Goods Yard Link Road axis provides a link from Hockerill Street in the north through to London Road in the south. A further link is provided from Station Road, which links London Road through to Dane Street. There is an additional pedestrian route from Station Road through to the west side of the Railway Station. The new proposed Parsonage Ward likewise fully respects local community links, offering strong transport links via Stansted Road and Parsonage Lane.
