I take it these boundaries are not merely geographical but take into consideration the number of people in each. I've noticed posters objecting to 4,500 new homes in Arborfield so I imagine that if built, numbers and ward borders will be adjusted accordingly for this and any other planned increase. It seems low cost housing has been grouped with new development which should create a balance if projects were in motion to show people that feel "poorer" how to contribute to their community with combined effort, if others in their community can be on board for this kind of shift instead of better off people making decisions for those who have not been brought up to understand the power of independence and democratic processes rather than dependency and a feeling of helplessness (at the mercy of decision makers choices that are neither anticipated nor understood) Surveys asking what changes would you make with unlimited budget and power and how would that change with current budget and choice of leadership plus how can each of us support our community and choice of leader in our day to day life and personal decisions to contribute skills or time & savings (not give cash) It was very interesting to see existing boundaries and I have no idea how many current councillors we have in each! (when clicking the 3 little lines at the top right, I was unable to find any of the "related links" mentioned in the 6th paragraph - perhaps they could be e-mailed to [REDACTED] (my grandfather was a member of parliament representing the Jewish community in Cape Town when my Dad was at school (around WWII) I'm very interested in local government because I understand that change happens from the bottom up, given good (fair, innovative and accountable) leadership.
