Re: Boundary Changes – Farnworth North.

The overall proposed boundary changes are significant improvement to the existing boundary.

As ward Councillors we have contacted our electors to seek their views on the proposed changes.

The outcome was those residents who reside on Bradford Road going towards Bolton coming down Minerva Road to junction of Green Lane and Bradford Road, Green Lane, up to Rishton Avenue on left feel more connected with the new proposed ward of Farnworth North.

We propose that instead of Greenland Road being the proposed boundary line it moved to Bradford Road, up Green Lane, up Rishton Avenue and Skelworth Avenue.

The residents living on Bradford Road, Green Lane, Rishton Avenue, Brooke Hey, Greenland Road, Oakleigh Avenue and part of Bishop Road will be in Farnworth North ward.

It will increase the number of residents in Farnworth North ward, but it will consolidate it and the boundary will be more definitive.

I hope the commission will consider our proposal.
