Boundary Commission Review of Telford & Wrekin ward boundaries. 2021/2022. I am a resident of Horsehay, and of Dawley Hamlets Parish and have lived here for some 13 years. I specifically moved to Horsehay because I believed there was a good community spirit and I am happy to say that this has proved to be the case. The community of Horsehay can be said to be based around the area of Horsehay Pool and this area includes the village hall, the preserved railway base, the two public houses, the chapel, the old Horsehay works area, the bowling club, the golf club and the common. There is also interaction with the Doseley and Lightmoor areas. The proposals made by Telford and Wrekin Council in August 2021 do not recognise the integrity of the Horsehay area at all, effectively butchering the community for electoral purposes, and attempting to create wards from areas with no natural affinity and totally failing to recognise and maintain the identity and integrity of the community, contrary to one of main considerations of the Local Government Boundary Commission's policy statement included in their draft recommendations for Telford & Wrekin of November 2021. I would like to express my broad support for the submissions of Dawley Hamlets Parish Councillor David Hopkins dated March 22nd and April 13th 2022, regarding a Dawley Hamlets and Lightmoor ward.
