Comment text:

I'm commenting in a personal capacity, having lived in Norris Green for 14 years. For seven of these I was [REDACTED] on Lower House Lane (the dividing line currently between Croxteth and Norris Green). I think that the general redrawing of the boundaries between Norris Green/Clubmoor (especially) and Norris Green/West derby and Norris green/Croxteth reflect better the natural affinities of who lives where and where they look to and most identify with, and which local amenities they are most likely to use. So very positive in general. But I also want to strongly support keeping a 3 councillor ward in Norris Green. It has a clear coherence and people cross the internal Norris Green boundaries proposed to access local services and amenities, including Broadway and the Strand, GP surgeries, and open spaces. There is a strong tradition of the local councillors for Norris Green in a ward with high deprivation levels working closely with local agencies, the RSLs, Norris Green Community Alliance, TRAs and local churches offering community support services (addressing food hardship, debt advice, and older people's isolation and much more). Keeping this as a multi-member ward will allow services to continue to be delivered in these partnerships more efficiently than if this outer estate community becomes fragmented into three wards.
