Bramley is in a ward with Busbridge and Hascombe but has no reasonable transport (a single single-track road), commercial, community, geographic or historical links to those parishes which are part of the wider Godalming area and connect into Godalming. However, Bramley does have extensive transport, commercial, community, geographic and historical links to Wonersh parish. The current structure is a line drawn on a map to fit population numbers but makes no sense other than to fit those numbers. It would be good if a structure could be found that makes the ward boundaries relevant to the communities: so Bramley, Wonersh, Chilworth and Shamley Green makes sense from every point of view - except perhaps population size. Bramley and Wonersh have been interwoven since at least the 11th century (when they were part of Bramley manor), it be good if this review could re-assemble what has always been a linked and integrated community. Just some of the links that exist between Bramley and Wonersh that don't exist for Bramley with Hascombe and Busbridge: local shops in Bramley are used by Wonersh, Wonersh Surgery is used by Bramley, Bramley Library is used by Wonersh, the main footpaths lie right between the two parishes, three road links and bus routes link the parishes, the churches are used by residents seeking different types of services (ie, Bramley uses Wonersh and vice versa) and so on...
