Honeybourne is increasing in size, with another housing development having been approved just last week, meaning we are fortunate enough to have facilities that most villages would be ecstatic to have. Two much loved pubs, a Chinese takeaway, fish & chip shop, Indian restaurant/takeaway, two shops (one with a post office), a brand new village hall and functioning church. We are incredibly lucky to have a direct train service to London which is a benefit to all the local villages, not just for Honeybourne.
