To whom it may concern - I have three times tried to submit my view via your council dialogue boxes but each time it rejects any of my three email addresses as 'not being valid'. Is this a deliberate way to avoid public consultation I wonder?

I hope this reaches you today, 11 December.

'I write to you about the current review proposals and in particular the decision to split Trinity Ward in Stroud away from Stroud Central and to place it into the Bisley and Painswick Division. Though perhaps a good idea to welcome one new Division being created within the Stroud area of the County this plan has very serious consequences.

I am strongly opposed to this proposal because Trinity is an intrinsic part of Stroud Town with numerous key buildings and facilities that make it part of the town. I understand this idea was raised the at a recent meeting of Stroud Town Council where there was unanimous opposition to the proposal. I know that they and many constituents will have written to you or will be writing to you to make their own opinions known but I also wanted to put on the record my own opposition.

One of the reasons that makes the proposal so unfair is that the new arrangements will literally split a road in half, Bisley Rd, with the Trinity part going into the Bisley and Painswick Division whilst the other side of the road in Slad Ward, remaining in Stroud Central.

I am also worried about the management of the services and amenities in our ward, Including the General hospital and minor injuries unit, the Maternity Hospital, the Schools and Parks , including Daisy Bank and the Graveyard, which under the new proposals would be covered by the Bisley and Painswick ward.

We in Stroud, have very different needs to those in Painswick and Bisley. These need are known and catered for well at the moment by Stroud Town Council.

In short, the proposals are unfair to the residents of Trinity, and Stroud and unworkable, We are “Old Stroud” in Trinity Ward and would like to stay that way.

Please rethink this and keep us where we belong. Or, might I suggest that the Bisley and Painswick areas join our own Trinity Ward?'
