**Related subject:** Broadway Division

The Boundary Commission has overlooked the amount of work connected with the village of Broadway that has a significant retail off, a major activity park 500k, two Museums, a hunt, runs major tourist events - Ferrari Days, Chocolate festival, Boxing Day Hunt, Broadway Arts Festival every other year, Annual Harvest Festival on the Green then the Food Festival and has a heritage railway plus Broadway Business Association.

The county council is responsible for economic sustainability, museums, tourism and Highways.

Plus one of the highest Worcestershire villages for dementia

And a high percentage of plus 55 homes

I already attend 9 village meetings a month, one meeting of the Broadway Business Association, one planning Meeting in Broadway, - that is 11 out of 20 evenings a month taken up with parish council meetings. Each parish council requires a detail report.

The work of Broadway a destination village with two International award winning hotels, 2 smaller hotels, 5 restaurants and 30 bed and breakfasts and around 500,000 visitors per year of which 140,000 are come on the heritage railway is considerable.

Plus I have County Council duties and responsibilities

It already takes me as councillor around 1.5 hrs in total to visit all parishes.

And 40 mins to visit furthest villages to look at Highway issues

I have a good stretch of the River Avon and its tributaries in my Division and the River Isbourne - both of which flood and have sewage outfall problems.

Being also an agricultural division I am currently dealing with run off and land drainage.

There are two major Highways A roads A46 - many deaths on my patch, A44 - Fish Hill a serpentine 9 % rise attracts motorcyclists from all over the country to race and have their photos taken there. The large bowl on Fish Hill creates a noise problem for the whole of Broadway village.

Badsey is a village which has major H G V problems, thousands of HGV's come to and leave Badsey as it is a major distribution area for agriculture

It is also the fastest growing population of Wychavon villages

I do appreciate you do not wish to split a ward but Sedgeberrow has much affinity with Bredon and Tewkesbury rather than Broadway.

Wickhamford being a Vale of Evesham agricultural village has much synergy with Badsey

I recommend you move Sedgeberrow to Bredon if Badsey is to move to Broadway Division

Otherwise the residents of Broadway itself will not be served as fairly as it should as Badsey is particularly demanding in view of its Economy and Agricultural needs.
