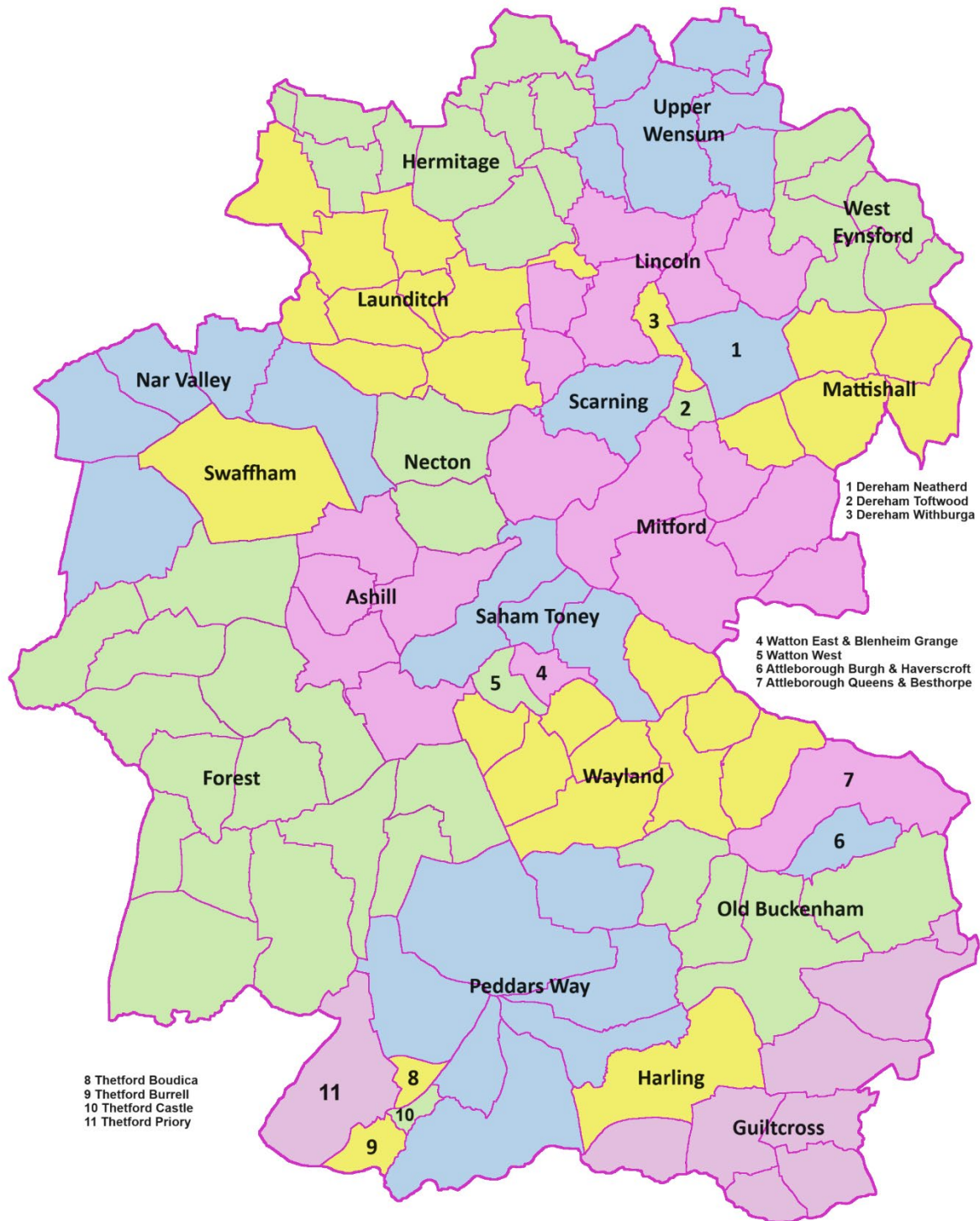


Set out below are my proposals for consideration as part of the current review of the District of Breckland. The proposal has 51 councillors, allocated to 30 wards of one, two and three members. All wards are within the 10% limits of electoral equality.

Ashill - The current ward except the Parish of Hilborough.

Forest - The northern part of the current Forest Ward plus the Bedingfield Ward and part of Ashill Ward. The parishes of Cockley Cley, Cranwich, Diddlington, Foulden, Gooderstone, Hilborough, Ickburgh, Lynford, Mundford, Oxborough, Stanford, Sturston, Tottington, and Weeting with Broomhill. The ward includes the whole STANTA training area. It is a large ward but contains many sparsely populated parishes. I have retained the name Forest Ward, as wards called “Conifer” and “Mid-Forest” previously covered the area. The parishes are connected by the A134, A1065 and B1108.

Mitford - The parishes of Garvestone, Reymersstone & Thuxton, Hardingham, Whinburgh & Westfield, Bradenham, Cranworth, and Shipdham. The parishes are connected by the A1075 and B1135. It is named after the former Hundred of Mitford covering a similar area. It could also be called Shipdham after the largest parish.

Nar Valley - No change from current ward.

Necton - No change from current ward.

Saham Toney - The current ward except for the parishes of Bradenham, Scoulton and the SA2/1 polling district of the Parish of Carbrooke.

Wayland - The northern part of the current Ward of All Saints and Wayland. The parishes of Caston, Great Ellingham, Griston (that part not in Watton East and Blenheim Grove, see below), Little Ellingham, Merton, Rocklands, Scoulton, Stow Bedon and Breckles, and Thompson. The parishes are connected by the A1075, B1077, B1108 and B1111. Named after the former Hundred of Wayland, which largely corresponds to the same area.

Mattishall – The parishes of East Tuddenham, Hockering, Mattishall, North Tuddenham, and Yaxham. A previous ward called Two Rivers had a similar configuration. The parishes are connected by the A47 and local roads.

Scarning - The Parish of Scarning.

Upper Wensum - The northern part of the current ward. The parishes of Billingford, Bintree, Brisley, Gateley, Guist, North Elmham, and Twyford. A previous ward called Upper Wensum had a similar configuration.

West Eynsford – A ward named Eynsford existed in this area previously, to avoid potential confusion with the Broadland ward of Eynesford, also named after the old Hundred, I propose calling it West Eynsford.

Guiltcross - The current ward plus the parishes of Banham, New Buckenham and Riddlesworth. The eight parishes are connected by the A1066, B1111, B1113, B1077.

Harling - The Parish of Harling.

Old Buckenham - The parishes of Old Buckenham, Quidenham, Shopham and Snetterton. The four parish are connected by the A11 and Hargham Road. For want of a better name, it is named after the largest parish.

Peddars Way - The parishes of Brettenham, Bridgham, Croxton, Hockham, Kilverstone, Roudham and Laring, and Wretham. The seven parishes are connected by the A11, A1066, A1075 and B1111. It is named after the Peddars Way which runs north-south through the centre of the area, a smaller ward with this name previously existed. It could also be named “Thet Valley”.

Thetford Castle - No change from current ward.

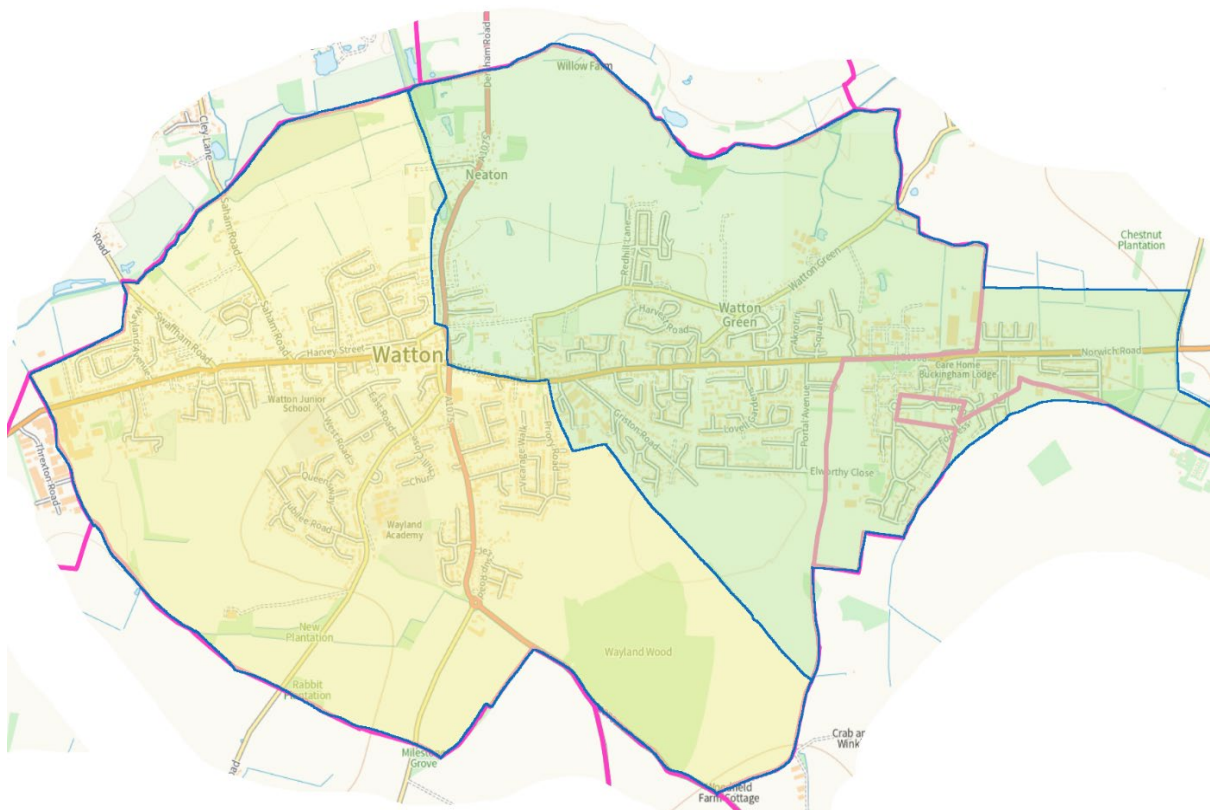
Thetford Priory - Current ward minus polling district TPR4 (Vicarage Road Town Ward).

Watton East & Blenheim Grange - That part of the Parish of Watton East of a dividing line from the southern boundary following the former railway line north, then running between Linmore Crescent and Priory Road, then running west along Norwich Road (B1108), then following the current boundary between the WA1 and WA2 polling district until the former railway line and running north to the parish boundary. Plus, the SA2/1 polling district and that part of the AL4 polling district in the Blenheim Grove development. I estimate this ward to have approximately 4556 electors. The Blenheim Grove development, although in the parishes of Carbrooke and Griston is effectively an extension of the Town of Watton. See map below.

Watton West - That part of the Parish of Watton not in the ward above. I estimate this ward to have approximately 4570 electors. See map below.
