When planning and building permissions were first given that was the time to have addressed such ward changes, not, 'after the horse has bolted' as I believe that this is a 'postcode' hierarchy attempt of MBC to ensure higher council tax fees are charged for living in Nunthorpe.

The following options for Nunthorpe have been identified as possibilities.

1. Nunthorpe Ward remaining as it is now, with the ward boundary identical to the Parish Boundary [ie all of Grey Towers Village, apart from Borrowby Rise and Plantation View, being part of Nunthorpe].
2. Nunthorpe Ward as it is now, but with the addition of Borrowby Rise and Plantation View, (transferred to Nunthorpe from Marton West.)
3. Nunthorpe Ward as it is now, but with the addition of Borrowby Rise, Plantation View and some houses off Brass Castle Lane as far as De Brus

Park (all transferred to Nunthorpe from Marton West).

4. Nunthorpe Ward smaller than it is now - by, for example, transferring all houses in Grey Towers Village to join Borrowby Rise and Plantation View in Marton West.

The LGBC is suggesting Option 3, and could either confirm this or could also be persuaded by feedback to adopt another of the options above.
