Related subject: Humberston

The village of Humberston is a thriving residential area on the outskirts of Grimsby. It benefits from a C of E church, well attended and well-maintained halls available for public hire and housing the Wendover playgroup, as well as educational establishments providing Primary and Secondary education. There are a variety of small shops, hairdressers, restaurants, public houses and take away venues and whilst there are few employment opportunities and no medical facilities it is otherwise a self-contained residential area. We recognise that it is not large enough to be a ward on its own but by joining with New Waltham which it already does physically, the two villages could form a large ward. The new houses, opposite Toll Bar academy on the right hand side of Louth Road heading towards Louth, however, would need to join Waltham otherwise the Humberston, New Waltham ward would be too large. The A16 forms a natural division between New Waltham and the new development and would make a sensible boundary. Following a meeting of the working group empowered to consider the response to this consultation, The Village Council are keen to ensure that Humberston village remains intact within a larger ward and is not dissected as there is no sensible way to do this.
