To drive from the East boundary settlement of Helperthorpe, to the named settlement of Sheriff Hutton in the West, is approximately 22 miles and 45 minutes. Sheriff Hutton is 10 miles from York arguably making it a commuter village, and it sits in the Easingwold school catchment area, meaning life in Sheriff Hutton is based to the West and South West of the village.

If you start in Helperthorpe and head East, it's less than 10 miles and a 20 minute drive to Hunmanby, the named settlement in the district to the East. People in Helperthorpe are not particularly united in where they live their lives; it's commutable to Malton, Driffield, Scarborough etc and children attend Norton secondary school, but many residents are retired, and spend more time locally. But there is a sense of 'belonging' to Weaverthorpe. Helperthorpe residents belong to the Weaverthorpe Facebook group, they participate in Weaverthorpe events, it's their nearest pub and many Helperthorpe residents can look out of their windows and see Weaverthorpe. Why has the decision been made to split Helperthorpe from Weaverthorpe?
